## Bihar Snap Poll Analysis: Executive Assessment

### Key Findings:

**Survey Details: October 15-19, 2025 | Sample Size: 10,859 | Rural-Urban: 30:70 | Male-Female: 52:48 Margin of Error: ±3%**

### 1. Campaign Promises Assessment

#### Tejashwi Yadav's 'Har Ghar Sarkari Naukri' Promise (Q1):

- 48.0% view it as a mere election slogan
- 38.1% see it as a good move that will help RJD electorally

#### Neutralization of Mahila Rozgar Yojana (Q2):

- 50.5% believe Tejashwi's scheme can neutralize Nitish's ₹10,000 Mahila Rozgar Yojana
- 25.5% say No; 24.0% can't say/don't know

### 2. Corruption Perception

#### IRCTC Scam Charges Against Lalu Yadav Family (Q3):

- 35.0% believe it will hurt MGB's electoral prospects
- 28.0% believe it will consolidate MGB's vote base and benefit MGB
- 19.7% believe it will have no impact

### 3. Leadership Legacy

#### Chief Minister Tenure Comparison (Q4):

- 56.7% favor Nitish Kumar's tenure (2005-2025)
- 16.4% favor Lalu Yadav-Rabri Devi era (1990-2005)
- 11.5% say both were equal; 10.1% say none

### 4. Party/Alliance Awareness

#### Jan Suraj Election Symbol Recognition (Q5):

- 48.4% don't know the symbol
- 35.0% correctly identified it as School Bag
- 16.5% wrongly identify the symbol

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### 5. Voter Motivation & Behavior

#### Primary Voting Reason (Q6):

- 33.7% vote for all of the above (holistic approach)
- 25.6% vote to elect a Chief Minister
- 17.5% vote to elect a Government
- 15.2% vote to elect an MLA

#### Caste Factor in Voting Decision (Q7):

- 51.1% will vote for preferred party over caste
- 21.1% will vote for caste regardless of the party
- 6.1% will not vote for party if caste candidate not fielded

### 6. Electoral Turnout Factor

#### Migrant Workers Staying Back to Vote (Q8):

- 66.2% believe migrant workers will stay back after Chhath Puja to vote

### 7. Win Perception

#### Who's Winning (Q9):

- 34.7% predict MGB (Mahagathbandhan) will win
- 34.4% predict NDA will win
- 12.3% predict Jan Suraj will win
- 8.4% predict Hung Assembly
